



CHANGES IN REGULATION FISCAL YEAR 2016

The following final regulatory actions were taken by the Mississippi State Board of Health in FY 2016:

JULY 2015

Final Adoption of Minimum Standards of Operation for Home Health Agencies

- Requires the supervising registered nurse to be accessible by telecommunications at all times while the LPN is treating patients; does not require the LPN to be present at the supervisory visit by the RN, but does not preclude it

Final Adoption of Regulations Governing the Registration of Medical Radiation Technologists

- Expanded and clarified the scope of practice of a Nuclear Medicine Technologist
- Established special certification requirements for a Nuclear Medicine Technologist to perform CT exams on hybrid equipment for diagnostic purposes
- Provided that a certified Nuclear Medicine Technologist may do on-the-job training on hybrid equipment under a qualified supervisor while qualifying for the required special certification for hybrid equipment

Rules and Regulations Governing Reportable Diseases and Conditions

- Class 1A or Class 1B reportable condition reclassified depending upon the urgency of the public health response
- Class 1B reportable conditions require individual case investigation, but not an immediate public health response and are to be reported by telephone one business day after first knowledge or suspicion
- All potential bioterrorism agents classified as Class 1A conditions
- Legionellosis and Noncholera Vibrio disease reclassified from Class 2 to Class 1B
- Dengue reclassified from Class 2 to Class 1B under Arboviral Infections
- Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease reclassified from a Class 1 to a Class 2 reportable condition
- Salmonellosis and Shigellosis moved from Class 2 to Class 3 Reportable Disease
- Blood lead test levels greater than 5µg/dL in patients less than 6 years of age reportable as a Class 2 condition
- All blood lead test results in patients less than 6 years of age reportable as a Class 3 condition
- Drug resistant organisms classified as Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriaceae (CRE) added as a Class 3 reportable disease
- Histoplasmosis and Blastomycosis are removed from the Reportable Diseases list

CHANGES IN REGULATION FISCAL YEAR 2016

OCTOBER 2015

Minimum Standards for the Operation of Ambulatory Surgical Facilities

- Added definition of local hospital to mean the most appropriate facility to which the Ambulatory Surgical Facility will transport patients in case of an emergency
- Revised Patient Transfer provisions to comply with Federal Regulations

Emergency Medical Services: Aero Medical Services

- Deleted and removed rule requiring basic life support care for Aero Medical Regulations
- Added Critical Care Paramedic and Advanced Practice Provider to reflect levels of Mississippi Licenses
- Air Ambulance licenses required to comply with local, state and national licensing requirements consistent with the Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems

Minimum Standards of Operation for Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care Centers (PPEC)

- Required food service permit from Mississippi State Department of Health, Office of Environmental Health
- Required full time on-site Center Administrator
- Automatic Sprinkler System required in accordance with NFPA 13 Standards
- Emergency Generator required in accordance with NFPA 110 Standards
- Fire Extinguishers required in accordance with NFPA 10 Standards
- Smoke detectors required in accordance with NFPA 72 Standards
- Maximum Occupant Load calculated based on 100 gross feet per person to include staff and each child
- Gross area calculations defined by current edition of NFPA 101 Life Safety Code

Mississippi State Board of Cosmetology Sanitation Rules and Regulations

- Approved Board of Cosmetology changes prohibiting the use of scalpels in any procedure or service
- Approved Board of Cosmetology changes prohibiting dermaplaning

JANUARY 2016

Minimum Standards of Operation for Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care Centers (PPEC)

- Added definition of PPEC Administrator and minimum qualification
- Clarified calculation of licensed capacity
- Clarifies that licensee is responsible for ensuring financial soundness of facility
- Limits amount of time a child may be in transport to one hour on a single trip
- Clarified the dispensing availability/choices for specific fluids/medications
- Required 35 square feet per licensed child for each play area

Mississippi Primary Drinking Water Regulations

- Modifications made in response to changes in the federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) that MSDH is required to incorporate into the Mississippi SDWA

FY 2015 Mississippi State Health Plan

- Revised to allow MSDH to approve services for the exclusive treatment of adults with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

CHANGES IN REGULATION FISCAL YEAR 2015

APRIL 2016

Rules and Regulations Governing Reportable Diseases and Conditions

- Emergency amendment to add Zika virus as a Class 1B Reportable Condition under the subsection Arboviral Infections, to facilitate notification of such cases

Rules and Regulations Governing the Newborn Screening Program and Birth Defects Registry

- Added Pompe Disease to the newborn screening panel

Minimum Standards for Institutions for the Aged and Infirm

- Modified to include definition of Ventilator Dependent Patient
- Specified requirements for personnel providing care and transport of ventilator dependent patients

Regulations Governing Licensure of Athletic Trainers

- Modified to align continuing education requirements from a two year cycle to a three year cycle to conform to the national certification board requirements

CHANGES IN STATE LAW

Legislative Update for the 2016 Mississippi Legislative Session:

SENATE BILL 2070. Signed 5/13/16. Effective 7/01/16.

- Enacts legislation to support and promote breast-feeding in Mississippi through legislative acknowledgement of the many benefits of breast-feeding; to authorize hospitals with birthing facilities to have a written infant feeding policy that supports breast-feeding in which all relevant staff must be sufficiently trained; to provide that maternal health care facilities should make every reasonable effort to display a "Breast-Feeding in Mississippi: Guidelines" sign publicly on their premises; to direct the Mississippi State Department of Health to prepare a video for presentation in offices of the Department in which the Department provides benefits to women of child-bearing age, which shall provide information about the importance of breast-feeding infants; to provide that applicants for and recipients of any such benefits provided by the department may view the video in the offices of the department; to authorize the department to provide the video to other state agencies that provide benefits to women of child-bearing age, for appropriate use by those agencies; to reenact sections 57-10-701 through 57-10-709, Mississippi Code of 1972, which create the small business and grocer investment act; to amend reenacted section 57-10-707, Mississippi Code of 1972, to prohibit the funding of any project that would be directly competing against an existing food retailer; to amend section 22 57-10-711, Mississippi Code of 1972, to extend the date of repeal on the sections of law that create the Small Business and Grocer Investment Act; and for related purposes.

SENATE BILL 2297. Signed 4/04/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Amends sections 41-75-1, 41-75-3, 41-75-5 and 41-75-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, to define "freestanding emergency room" for the purpose of licensure by the Mississippi State Department of Health; to require a license to operate and provide procedures for application; and for related purposes.

SENATE BILL 2387. Signed 4/06/16. Effective 7/01/16.

- Amends section 27-103-159, Mississippi Code of 1972, to require state agencies to include information regarding any maintenance of effort (MOE) agreements with the federal government in their annual budget request to the legislative budget office; and for related purposes.

SENATE BILL 2625. Signed 4/13/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Amends section 43-11-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, to provide authority for the Mississippi State Department of Health to process fingerprints of students in health care settings; and for related purposes.

SENATE BILL 2661. Signed 4/13/15. Effective 7/01/16.

- Amends section 41-7-173, Mississippi Code of 1972, to revise the definition of "capital expenditure" and "change of ownership" and "clinical health services" for the purpose of health care certificate of need review; to amend section 41-7-193, Mississippi Code of 1972, to clarify procedures for applying for a Health Care Certificate of Need; to amend section 41-7-197, Mississippi Code of 1972, to clarify procedures for Health Care Certificate of Need hearings; to amend section 41-7-201, Mississippi Code of 1972, to revise the procedures for judicial appeals of any final order of the Mississippi State Department of Health pertaining to a certificate of need for a home health agency or other health care facility; to amend section 41-7-205, Mississippi Code of 1972, to prescribe a procedure

for an application for a Determination of Reviewability by the Mississippi State Department of Health for certain defined Capital Expenditures and to prescribe fees therefor; and for related purposes.

HOUSE BILL 81. Signed 4/04/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Creates new section 41-57-26, Mississippi Code of 1972, to authorize the Office of Vital Records Registration to furnish without charge, up to five certified copies of the death certificate of any deceased person who was an honorably discharged military veteran or who was killed or died while serving on active duty in the military.

HOUSE BILL 289. Signed 5/17/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Provides that the Mississippi State Board of Health or the Mississippi State Department of Health may increase the amount of any fee charged for providing a service not more than two times during the next four fiscal years, with the percentage of each increase being not more than fifteen percent of the amount of the fee in effect at the time of the increase; amends section 45-14-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, to increase the fees that may be charged by the Mississippi State Board of Health for certain radiological health services and authorizes the Mississippi State Board of Health to increase the amount of those fees not more than two times during the next four fiscal years, with the percentage of each increase being not more than five percent of the amount of the fee in effect at the time of the increase.

HOUSE BILL 494. Signed 4/04/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Amended section 37-13-171, Mississippi Code of 1972, to extend by five years the repealer on the provision of law requiring every school district to adopt a policy to implement abstinence-only or abstinence-plus education into its curriculum; to abolish and dissolve the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Task Force; and for related purposes.

HOUSE BILL 878. Signed 5/09/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- Extends the repealer on Section 43-13-405, Mississippi Code of 1972, The Health Care Trust Fund, to July 1, 2017.


HOUSE BILL 1369. Signed 4/07/16. Effective upon passage.

- Amended section 41-29-113, Mississippi Code of 1972, to add Acetyl Fentanyl and Synthetic Cathinones to the list of stimulants in Schedule I and to exclude loflupane; to amend section 41-29-115, Mississippi Code of 1972, to provide that Hydrocodone is a schedule II substance even when in combination with other materials and to exclude Naloxegol as a controlled substance; to amend section 41-29-117, Mississippi Code of 1972, to add the drug Perampanel to schedule III; to amend section 41-29-119, Mississippi Code of 1972, to add the drugs Alfaxalone and Suvorexant to schedule IV; and for related purposes.

HOUSE BILL 1651. Signed 5/11/16. Effective 7/1/16.

- An appropriation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi State Department of Health for the Fiscal Year 2017.




INFANT MORTALITY IN MISSISSIPPI, 2006–2015



AIDS RATES BY YEAR, UNITED STATES AND MISSISSIPPI, 2005–2014




TUBERCULOSIS RATES BY YEAR,

UNITED STATES AND MISSISSIPPI, 2006-2015




VACCINATION COVERAGE AMONG CHILDREN 19-35 MONTHS, BY YEAR, MISSISSIPPI AND UNITED STATES











FUNDING SOURCES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016 EXPENDITURES






