

## Office of Women's Health, Healthy Moms/Healthy Babies Program **Epidemiologist II**

[Contract Position, 40 Hrs./Week]

The Mississippi State Department of Health's Healthy Moms/Healthy Babies Program is seeking to fill a full-time **Epidemiologist II** contract position. This is a mid-level position that is responsible for carrying out a broad and complex range of investigative and analytical epidemiologic activities including surveillance, research, data analyses, and disseminating analytical reports relative to health conditions that impact mothers and babies. In addition, duties will involve overseeing and conducting advanced-level professional epidemiologic tasks by managing methods of collecting, analyzing, and disseminating data related to leading causes of morbidity and mortality for women and infants.

Qualified applicants should have the following minimum qualifications:

- Knowledge of conducting surveillance and data analyses
- Knowledge of analytical software including SPSS, SAS, R, and/or Microsoft Excel
- Knowledge of public health evaluation
- Knowledge of health disparities and/or social determinants of health

Qualified applicants should have a degree in statistics, public health, epidemiology, and/or related field and some experience in analyzing data and/or conducting epidemiologic research. The rate of pay for this position is \$29.93/hour. The tentative start date for this position is July 1, 2024.
