

## **Child Care Regulations Reminders**

Fall is making its' way on the scene, and creeping behind it is the illness and sickness that we normally encounter during the month of September with the season change. Therefore, we wanted to take this opportunity to remind you that "small children who are cared for in out-of-home group settings are at a greater risk of acquiring and spreading a contagious disease" (Office of Health Protection-Office of Licensure, 2022, p.254). September is a great time to thoroughly clean your facilities and stay abreast of the common contagious diseases so that you will be able to recognize the signs and symptoms which you can find in the Appendix I:

Communicable Diseases/Conditions and Return to Child Care Guidelines of the Regulation Book. Also, please take a moment to become familiar and knowledgeable of Appendix H: Cleaning and Disinfection

Procedures as well as Appendix F: Handwashing Procedure. Taking a moment to review and implement this information can decrease the likelihood of an outbreak and reduce germs.
