Child Care Regulations Reminders

Providers below are a few important Regulations reminders for you to remember when hiring new employees at your facilities.

- Before a prospective staff member may begin work in a childcare facility, a valid Letter of Suitability must have been issued by the MSDH Criminal Records Check Unit (Rule 1.5.2, 1).
- The childcare facility shall submit the following for processing: (1) Completed fingerprint card & fees submitted to MSDH for processing and (2) Child Abuse Registry form shall be submitted to MSDH via DocuSign for processing (Rule 1.5.2, 1a-b).
- Remember, Letter of Suitability are not transferable to another program licensed by the Child Care Licensure Division after the date of expiration OR if there is a break in service of more than 180 consecutive days of employment (Rule 1.5.2, c, d).






