Preface

The following table contains the latest set of figures showing Mississippi's status for selected Healthy People 2000 objectives. The list includes those objectives that can be calculated using data from vital records and surveillance data collected by the Mississippi State Department of Health.

Please note that many of the rates are age-adjusted and will not match those shown in the Vital Statistics annual publication. In addition, there may be slight differences in the definition of some rates shown in this table as compared to other published rates. The objectives represented in the table are those that could be calculated following the same methodology used to calculate the Year 2000 baseline data. No attempt was made to provide surrogate measures for objectives that could not be measured directly. Note that many of the Healthy People 2000 objectives are duplicated in the original document¹ under different sections with different objective numbers. In the table below the objective number indicates the first section where the objective is listed.
