Newborn Hearing Screening



- Infants who did not pass an automated auditory brainstem response (AABR) hearing need a repeat screening.
- Both ears should be tested with each screening even if only one ear did not pass.
- No more than two valid inpatient screening attempts should be performed. One optional outpatient screening may be performed.

- Each year 6,500 infants are born deaf or hard of hearing.
- Hearing loss is one of the most common birth defects.
- Newborns should be screened for hearing loss before leaving the hospital.
- A hearing loss can delay a child's speech and language development, impacting their thinking, learning, and social skills.
