	of EMS/ACS Report	Anyone who is interested in joining this committee, please contact Dr. Donald. Trauma Care Trust Fund – The current distribution for FY 2024 is in the routing process. The last distribution we paid was a little over \$14 million. Dr. Donald stated that we are capped to only spend \$28 million. Designated Trauma Centers – The current number of designated trauma centers across the state follows. Level II – 3 Level III – 16 Level IV – 64 In-State Burn Center – 2 Out-of-State Burn Center – 1 Ms. Windham stated that we have one burn center application out of the state. Pediatrics breakdown is currently: 79 Primary 6 Secondary 79 Single Channel Telehealth Solution Proposed – We have been working on a task group for Telehealth. Ms. Windham asked the group if they would like to continue to work on this task group. Dr. Donald stated that this was down to two different providers that could provide a single channel telehealth solution that could be used

She will talk about the bed tracking tool. This reporting is required by 10:00 am daily from all hospitals. She will give updates and upcoming changes to this system. Dr. Donald stated that the CEC committee have been looking at Birmingham, AL, Arkansas, and the San Antonio metropolitan area system of bed tracking. Ms. Barry stated that she would like to get information on the system(s) they have. The system we are currently using is not in real time.	
ii. BACS Data System Report	 Ms. Windham - Due to the trauma registry being down for two weeks, we do not have any reports currently. ESO will attend the meeting to explain what happened. Representatives Samuel Brown, Chris Montera, Mark Davidson, and Danielle Collins with ESO joined the call to go over what happened with the registry. Mr. Brown stated that on September 28th, ESO security noticed some irregular activity. As a result, ESO initiated a plan to bring the system off-line. This did include the registry anywhere system. This remained off-line until early this

At this time, the registry anywhere should be available. ESO has been restoring access to users. ESO will continue their investigation into the activity in the system. At this point, ESO could not make a commit at this point but should have more information in the future with a conclusion of the investigation. • Dr. Donald asked if the state would be receiving a partial refund due to the system being down. Mr. Brown stated that they would look into it. • Ms. Windham will send the data reports out via email in the upcoming weeks. 1. We hoped to have all the responses back by November 1^{st,} but we will not meet this deadline. Trauma Rules & Regulations: Ms. Kyle – Ms. Kyle has been working with Ms. Windham on the new purple book by the ACS. Representation from each level of trauma centers as well as three levels of pediatric centers have been tasked with going through the new standards and giving feedback on the new standards.
