EMERGENCY KIT

- Prescription medications

- ☐ Medical information: allergies, serious conditions, current medications
- First-aid kit: antiseptic, gloves, bandages, non-prescription medicine
- **Radio:** battery-powered with extra batteries
- **Flashlight:** extra batteries
- **Extra clothes:** footwear, eyeglasses

Personal hygiene items: soap, toilet paper, toothbrush and toothpaste

Pandemic Influenza:

WHAT IS IT?

A virus, different from seasonal flu, which people have not been exposed to. This virus would spread easily from person to person and cause serious illness around the world.

Pandemic Flu Preparation:

WHAT CAN CHILD CARE PROVIDERS DO?

- **Teach** children the importance of hand washing and how to wash their hands properly.
- Stay home from work if you are sick.
- Watch child closely for symptoms of respiratory illness. Contact parent(s) and doctor if the child is sick.



- **Do NOT** give aspirin to children with flu-like symptoms.
- **Talk** with parents about child care options in case you cannot provide care.
- **Tell** parents to let you know if their child is sick.
- Have a plan for keeping in touch with families and coworkers.
- Give families and coworkers accurate, reliable, and up-to-date information.
- Provide hand soap and antibacterial gel, tissue, and trash cans in all rooms.
